

HYMN HISTORY of 'WHEN MORNING GILDS'THE SKIES'

Written by Edward Caswall (1814 – 1878). This hymn is a famous old German folk song translated into English by Edward Caswall in 1853. One of the first churches to use this hymn was St. Paul's Episcopal Church in London, England, where leaflets were printed and distributed so all the congregation could share in the singing of this beautiful music. One of England's eminent ministers of

the 19th century, Canon Liddon, considered this one of the greatest of all the Church hymns and requested that it be sung at his funeral service.


Looking Ahead – Save the Date! Annual Holiday Fair – Saturday November 23rd!
