Community Suppers





United Methodist Women's 150th Birthday

"When I find a field too hard for a man, I put in a woman." Bishop William Taylor

Methodist Women have been involved in mission and service for over 150 years. A birthday celebration was held on March 23, 2019, 150 years to the day from the first meeting of a handful of women who would form *The Woman's Foreign Missionary Service of the Methodist Episcopal Church*.

In 1869, eight women started *The Woman's Foreign Missionary Society* on Tremont Street in Boston, now known as *United Methodist Women*. They raised funds to send Isabella Thoburn and Dr. Clara Swain to India where they cared for women, trained them to be educators and health care providers. The Clara Swain Hospital was also built.

When they returned home, they spoke of the oppression of women in India. The Society decided to do something for their sisters in other parts of the world. From these beginnings emerged the most powerful, influential women's movement in what was then the

largest protestant church in the United States. The Woman's Foreign Missionary Society sent its own missionaries, bought its own property, published its own periodicals, sponsored indigenous Bible women around the world, mobilized church women into a worldwide movement, and incubated women's leadership by providing a core group of the first Laywomen elected to General Conference in 1888.
