Stuff - Part 1

Bad language aside, George Carlin, comedian and philosopher, had some good insights. I listened to his riff on "Stuff" recently.

It wasn't the first time I'd heard it, but it was heard through Lenten ears.

George notices that I keep my stuff in my house. In fact, the main purpose of buying my house is to keep and display my stuff.

My stuff is valuable to me, so I lock it up so other people won't take my stuff.

My stuff makes me comfortable, so I go to work each day so that I can buy more stuff.

Sometimes we need to buy a bigger house so

Sometimes we need to buy a bigger house so we can buy even more stuff.

There is more to his sermon, but you get the idea.

Stuff - Part 2

. . . At some point, many of us begin the process

of downsizing and removing stuff from our homes. Sometimes this means reversing the process and buying a smaller house

- which forces us to give away our stuff.

Some will sell their stuff on Craigslist or such, and some stuff is worthy of being donated to charity. Sometimes our kids want our stuff, other times they respectfully decline our precious items – sadly, a most common occurrence.

Often when someone needs to go to an assisted living facility it is the last stage of downsizing

our stuff. Only a few of those most sentimental items – family pictures, religious items, and items that represent our life and accomplishments – will make the trip with us.

Most of us began our adult life with little "stuff".

Now, de-cluttering is a hot topic in our culture. Can you hear Jesus' words about having two coats? Do we own our stuff or does our stuff own us?

I read recently of a pastor who annually took all the books he had bought in the past year and put them in a box. After a year, if he hadn't used

any one of them, he gave the whole lot away.

Stuff - Part 3

Jesus said it is hard to be rich in stuff and attain eternal life; to be able to follow him no matter where he leads us. Jesus knew about our stuff, about the folly of building bigger barns to store more of our stuff.

He knew the weight, on our minds and upon our spirit, of acquiring and caring for our stuff. He showed us that our sin is the way that our stuff, our valuable and treasured possessions, captures our interest and takes root in our hearts.

This sin blocks Christ from living richly in our hearts, and places him in a cluttered corner... our efforts fail to recognize the spiritual warfare that comes with acquiring, caring for, and indeed loving our stuff...

And if we seek more stuff, we do so at our peril.
